*From the Pastor's Desk*

## “A Gold(en) Moment!”

Throughout the month of February I've enjoyed watching NBC's coverage of the Winter Olympics. There's so many intriguing story lines: the struggles & successes of Mikaela Shiffrin & Nathan Chen, Norway's Attacking Vikings, the coming together of North & South Korea, etc. But there's one storyline in particular that I'd like to share with you today. It's the story of Aljona Savchenko.

Pairs figure skater Savchenko was born in Ukraine, in 1984, and competed in her first Olympic competition in 2002, at the Salt Lake City Games, for her home country. That year, Savchenko and her partner came in 15th place. In 2003, she moved to Germany, and competed in the 2006, 2010 and 2014 Olympic games for Germany with a new partner. After winning her second bronze at the 2014 games in Sochi, she thought her time was up. But after finding a new partner in Bruno Massot, Savchenko made the trip to Pyeongchang determined to make her fifth Olympics her best ever.

After the first round of the pairs figure skating competition, Savchenko and Massot were in fourth place. As the [Washington Post](#) put it, *"her hopes for an Olympic gold medal should have been dashed."* After the first round, Massot was demoralized. He said, *"It was hard for me, but Aljona was there for me. She said: 'It is not finished. We still have the free program to come. I got the gold medal in my head.'"*

When the duo woke up for the second round of the Olympic competition, the free program, they both were determined to make the impossible happen. And what happened next was nothing short of remarkable. Savchenko didn't give up. She continued to fight...and skate. That afternoon Savchenko and Massot aced their performance and received a score of 159.31. That score was enough to surpass China's five-point lead, put themselves in first place and set a world record. It was in Pyeongchang, that the 34-year-old Savchenko won her first gold medal.

As I thought about this story and these Olympics, I thought about Jesus and how He came to be our Champion. Jesus came to deliver us from our sin, release us from the power of death, and to conquer the devil. **Hebrews 2:14-15**, says, *"Since therefore the children share in flesh and blood, (Jesus) himself partook of the same things, that through death he might destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil, and deliver all those who though fear of death were subject to lifelong slavery."* When Jesus was dying on the cross, it looked like our hope for victory would be dashed. Just before he died, Jesus spoke. He said, *"It is finished."* (John 19:30)

Notice Jesus didn't say *"I am finished."* Look again—he said, *"IT is finished."* The "it" stands for Jesus' work of atonement. Through Jesus' death, mankind has been united, we have been reconciled to God. And what happened next is nothing short of amazing! Three days later, Jesus is alive! In his resurrection, you and I are made champions! Jump up and down, hoot and holler, hug and high five those near you! Let these words sink into your very being: You and I are **CHAMPIONS** over sin, death, and the power of Satan. We definitely don't deserve it. God looks so favorably on you and me because of the love and mercy shown in the death and resurrection of His Son.

We may not have a gold medal, but we have something better—We have a Savior! **1 Corinthians 15:54b-57** declares that because of Jesus, *"death is swallowed up in victory. O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting? The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ."*

If you've watched the Olympics, you'll know that after each competition, the gold, silver, and bronze winners stand

together at the podium. The national anthem of the winner’s country is then played on a loud speaker. Picture the day where, because of Jesus, we will be gathered in heaven with the angels and the saints of God singing together, “*Holy, holy, holy is the Lord God Almighty...*” (Rev. 4:8) What a day that will be! But until that day, we can celebrate the victory we have in Jesus, not just in our heads, but let’s hold it close to our hearts.

Congrats champ! The victory is yours in Jesus. You’re a winner! Let’s celebrate!

We just wanted to update everyone on the youth group's quest to head to the National Youth Gathering. Our group currently has eight youth that are working towards attending the gathering. The group has enjoyed our fundraising activities as well as serving opportunities and some fun group events. ## Sunday School

On Palm Sunday the children made risen rolls in honor of our Savior rising from the tomb on Easter morning. If you have never tried these rolls here is the recipe ~ they are easy and fun to make and a great way to visual show children the story of Easter.

Allrecipes.com calls them **Resurrection Rolls**

### Ingredients:

- 1 (10 oz) can refrigerated crescent dinner rolls
- 8 large marshmallows
- ¼ cup melted butter
- 2 tablespoons ground cinnamon
- 2 tablespoons white sugar

### Directions:

Preheat oven to 400 degrees F (200 degrees C).  
Lightly grease a baking sheet.  
Separate crescent rolls into individual triangles.  
In a small bowl, mix together cinnamon and sugar.  
Dip a marshmallow into melted butter, then roll in sugar mixture. Place marshmallow into the center of a dough triangle. Carefully wrap the dough around the marshmallow. Pinch the seams together tightly to seal in marshmallow as it melts. Place on a baking sheet.  
Repeat.  
Bake in a preheated oven until golden brown, about 15 minutes.  
Allow rolls to cool, and break them open to see the empty center. Then eat them!

# A Stewardship Moment

## FEAR

Gavin goes to camp, he loves to go to camp, and he loves the experience of camp. As he is moving throughout the camp he hears snippets of conversation about animal sightings but the messages are confusing and he is more focused on the camp experience. Day 4 arrives and the level of excitement ratchets up because that is the day of the camp out and the S'more gluttony festival. 50 boys march through the woods until they come to this beautiful clearing perfect for a campsite, they gather wood and build fires which seemed like the natural thing to do. It is now time for dinner and food cooked over a fire is so unsophisticatedly elegant, it is difficult to describe. The crowning glory for this meal though is "S'mores" and more "S'mores" until both the internal reaches and the external surfaces of each of these boys are satiated with S'mores. It is time to set up the sleeping, some boys brought tents, some actually brought hammocks but Gavin planned to sleep under the stars. He threw out the tarp and he and his friend laid out their sleeping bags and prepared for bed. Nights in the woods can be very quiet and they laid there in the silence only a short time when Gavin's friend reports hearing something but Gavin retorts, "yah a cricket everything is fine". Only a bit latter one of the other boys reports that he too has heard a strange noise and it's about that time Gavin also hears this strange noise. It is time to consult a higher authority and the counselors are engaged. Soon they hear this noise but it is much louder and seems nearer, they appear a little alarmed but two of them volunteer to investigate and start walking towards the sound with flashlights a short time elapses and one of the counselors returns exclaiming, "The bear got Mark". At that point the boys went from apprehension to terror and while the counselors were excited they decided to go in mass to rescue Mark telling the boys to stay by the fire and "Do not be afraid" yeh right. The counselors returned periodically anxious and excited some even with blood on them. The boys were unable to discern what was happening but they too were agitated almost to the extent of hysteria. After some time past all the counselors returned exclaiming that the bear had left and all was well, mysteriously Mark also was back and seemed quite well. The boys were not and consequently spent the rest of the night in front of the fire which had now grown to a 20 foot inferno, certainly a fire of that dimension would discourage a bear from coming near. When morning arrived the counselors revealed that the whole thing was a joke and that there never was a bear but for the boys the event was just too real for them to accept that and some even said they had seen the bear.

Fear is debilitating and in a chronic state of fear you become paralyzed but Franklin Roosevelt said that "Fear" was really the only thing we should fear and it is true that if you are living in fear you should be afraid but only of the fear you are living in which can destroy your rationality, decision making ability and even end your life.

We see in ([Matthew 8:23-27](#)) how the disciples dealt with fear as Jesus herded them into the boat headed to the Gerasenes and when the storm came up their motto was, "the only thing we have to fear is Everything" and that is when they exclaimed to Jesus, "We're going to drown" to which He responded by questioning their faith and making

the storm go away. Another boat ride ([Matthew 14:22-33](#)) revealed that they hadn't learned a lot only this time Jesus left them alone in the boat and it was not until they had struggled all night that just before dawn he arrived strolling across the water which had to be truly fear inspiring since it isn't often you see anyone walking on water, apparently impetuous Peter was the only brave one and actually got out of the boat to walk with Jesus and briefly did just that, as Peter and Jesus got back into the boat the storm was over and fear subsided.

Finally ([Matthew 26](#)) Jesus revealed the betrayal to His disciples and explains what His absence will be like ([John 15:18-16:33](#)). Even though He said, "take heart! I have overcome the world" at this point they had to be terrified, since Jesus was the only reason that all of them weren't in jail by that time. They even questioned Him as to who would be so foolish to do a thing like that and even impetuous Peter when he was told of his denial, exclaimed that he would die with Him. As Jesus predicted, once the soldiers dragged Him away to Caiaphas all the Disciples went into hiding except for John and Peter and we all know what Peter did at this point ([Matthew 26:69-75](#)). Only the ladies were specifically reported as being at the cross along with the mysterious "Apostle Whom Jesus Loved" were present at the cross.

It wasn't really until Jesus materialized in the room that the disciples were cowering behind locked doors in that things changed. Amazingly, even though Jesus had spent 3 years with these men it wasn't until the 40 days that He spent with them after His resurrection that they finally got what Jesus' mission really was and how they fit into that mission(a prime example of, "If it weren't for the last minute nothing would get done"). After the distribution of the "Holy Spirit" they became emboldened even to speak in languages that they didn't know ([Acts 2:14-47](#)).

Suddenly they had lost the fear factor that had embraced their whole time with Jesus and they were praising God regularly for that and other things. There is no better example of that than in ([Acts 5:25-45](#)). The disciples were called before the same authorities who only a short while ago had Jesus executed and now those same people are threatening the apostles with the same fate if they persist in teaching of the messiahship of Jesus. Peter, the same guy who denied Jesus in fear of his life is now standing up to the these authorities and actually accusing them of Jesus' death, Gamaliel convinced them not to execute the disciples and instead they were flogged (not a pleasant experience) with the expectation that the next time could yield different results. Did they stop? No!! In fact they went away rejoicing and went right back to the temple teaching. So it is now the only thing they have to fear is "Nothing".

It is hard to be scared TO death when you aren't scared OF death, Paul recounts this in ([Philippians 1:20-24](#)) *I eagerly expect and hope that I will in no way be ashamed, but will have sufficient courage so that now as always Christ will be exalted in my body, whether by life or by death. For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain. If I am to go on living in the body, this will mean fruitful labor for me. Yet what shall I choose? I do not know! I am torn between the two: I desire to depart and be with Christ, which is better by far; but it is more necessary for you that I remain in the body.* Paul saw his life as service to Christ but he had lived in that service

long enough to know that at any time that service could end his life but he was ready even for that.

The question for every Christian to ask themselves is, "Is my service to Christ worth losing my life over?" While it is true that not many American citizens will be faced with that dilemma, even in America there will be challenges to your faith and those confrontations could jeopardize other aspects of your life.
